One cannot understand Teresa J Cuevas' artwork (Madrid 1988) without taking into account her education and architectural devotion. Her work as an architect in South Korea, with artist Jinnie Seo and in the studio One or One Architects, was the most anchoring influence to her foundation. These 4 years building residential homes, monumental installations, opera stages, and luxury shop windows have generated an Asian influence in her work, which can be sensed at first glance in her studio and artwork.

In 2015, after many years with a notebook as a graphic diary, she began her professional career as an artist, already settled in Madrid. Persistence and work took her from one studio to another until, in 2021, she designed and built her own studio/gallery where she currently creates and exhibits her works.

In this space, we enter two worlds. We find one from "inside out", in which the winds, sands and different elements of nature star in the canvases with light as the main element. The other world is the result of an "outside in" look in which the artist investigates her own person, the subconscious and human behavior. We can see how these two worlds dialogue and even intertwine with each other.

In this first world, the "Naturaleza y luz" series dominates, evolving and experimenting with the material that gives life to the texture and invites you to become part of the landscape of the work. It highlights a search for balance between the heavy and the light, the full and the empty, the light and the shadow, the serene and what is in movement.

It is in the second world where we find the collections "*la espera*", "*avance*", "*horizonte y tierra*" and "*encuentros*", which tell us stories about motherhood, emotional and spiritual growth, the present and future aspirations, always inviting the spectator to contemplate and introspect.

SERIES:



This collection invites us to explore different milestones along our journey. It encourages us to look within our own nature and discover those moments that define us, marking a clear before and after. Its vibrant lines, balanced and minimalist, reveal a strong Asian influence in the materials and echoes of artists Eusebio Sempere and Fernando Zóbel.

Evolving since its inception in 2011 (South Korea), this series reflects biographical references to Teresa's life in each piece. Yet the true protagonist is the viewer and their own reflection—the inner search we all undertake, embarking first on an emotional journey, followed by a spiritual one.

The collection reveals two distinct creative processes: one involving textures that are caressed or scratched, symbolizing the duality of life; the other featuring light, pure white paper, torn during a meditative process. At times, these works are tinted with the nuances of different states of consciousness.

In these two interconnected approaches, the artist hopes we can all uncover a deeply significant phase of our lives, surrounded by clarity. She invites us to find the pillars of our personal histories, vital marks that propel us forward. This series abstracts the progression of life to its simplest form, allowing only intuition and reflection to awaken within us a sense of recognition, transforming those moments into something beautiful.

The artist explains:

"We are what we live—the sum of our circumstances and the moments that shape us. But it is up to us to transcend them and create a path of healing with some of them. I treasure these moments as part of the process of self-discovery, progress, and the pursuit of beauty in my own life."

There is no legend that says that the landscape is made by the observer just as the observer is made by the landscape and yet that is the mark we all leave between the horizon and the land.


Behind us, a vital impulse appears that brings us closer, over time, to the purpose that gives meaning to the path. Disparate lives with a common trait:

This series tries to capture the strength and delicacy of waiting for a light result.












This series is inspired by the simplest details that, especially in nature, awaken all our senses and wonder.

"Estratos de luz" is a series that I started in September 2020 and I still have a lot of work, research and movement to do around it.


It emerged from my fascination for the rock formations and cliffs of the Portuguese coast, of how nature surpasses itself with every step you take.


